This last year as been difficult for many people, the impact of Covid and government restrictions during much of the last twelve months as affected, and changed things for many people.

They also provided us with pictures for our Facebook page, for Advent and the Easter season. Our thanks also go to Mark and Tess Link for the Christmas Tree, which last year we were able to display outside the Church.

During the past twelve months, on Mothering Sunday, we have distributed flowers to those who have regularly attended our Soup lunch. We have also distributed a book that was put together by Methodist Staff in South Shropshire, called "The little book of Advent". Christmas and Easter magazines have also been given out.

On VE day we took Cream teas to a couple of senior associates of the Church. People have also been supported by telephone calls, and a News letter as been produced which was distributed weekly, this is now fortnightly.

With the Government plans to ease restriction again in June we hope to be able to begin having some Coffee Mornings again, plus some other social events.
